1900	Rhyswg Fawr Farmhouse and walled forecourt Grade II listed building. Upland farmhouse incorporating a former byre, built in the 17 th century. Prior to construction of the present structure, the land was originally part of Llantarnam abbey Estate. It was formerly called Rhyswg Grange, which is probably in reference to a medieval outlier of the monastic settlement. It is situated 150m west of the Site.	Post Medieval	322657	194604
20995	Welsh Presbyterian Church Grade II Listed building. Built in 1853 by Sir Benjamin Hall, a local landowner. The structure comprises of a simple small chapel in Gothic Revival Style. The structure, originally known as the Welsh Church, has been almost entirely unaltered since its opening. It is situated 980m west of the Site.	Post-Medieval	321729	195012
20998	Barn at Rhyswg Fawr Grade II Listed Building. A long barn that was originally part of the Rhyswg Fawr Farmhouse and was formerly used as a dwelling. The canal stretched from Crumlin in the western valley through to Rogerstone and eastwards to meet the eastern Valley branch at Crindau. E008730	<p>Blaen Bran Community Woodland, Upper Cwmbran</p> <p>A DBA carried out by Bob Trett on behalf of the Blaen Bran Community Woodland. Along with the documentary survey, the assessment additionally comprised of two Site visits.</p> <p>Blaen Bran was part of the manor of Edlogan and the area immediately above the ruins of Blaen Bran Farm was part of the Lord's waste of the manor. The area surveyed is located 375m east of the Site.</p>	NA	NA	NA
E006037	<p>Cwmcarn Forest Drive, Caerphilly</p> <p>A DBA conducted in 2013 by Archaeology Wales, along with a walkover survey. The survey concluded that the works would impact 21 places consisting of dry-stone wall boundaries, two possible house/charcoal burning platforms, a mound and a possible quarry. An archaeological watching brief was suggested.</p> <p>The area surveyed is adjacent to the southern section of the Site.</p>	NA	NA	NA
